Book'em creates a more literate Nashville by helping economically disadvantaged children from birth through high school discover the joy and value of reading through book ownership and enthusiastic volunteers.

Book'em programs include:

- Books for Nashville Kids provides books year-round to children from birth through high school without many books of their own.
- Ready for Reading places reading volunteers in community preschools focusing on children in low-income areas. These reading role models read with small groups of preschoolers once a week.
- Reading Is Fundamental (RIF) places volunteers in Title I elementary schools in Davidson County providing readers and books to these children five or eight times throughout the school year.

"In middle income neighborhoods the ratio of books per child is 13 to 1, in low-income neighborhoods the ratio is 1 age-appropriate book for every 300 children." Neuman, Susan B. and David K. Dickinson, ed. Handbook of Early Literacy Research, Volume 2. 2006

You Can Help:

- Become a reading role model volunteer contact Pam Sheridan at volunteers@bookem-kids.org.
 - Through Reading Is Fundamental (RIF), volunteers read and distribute books to their assigned elementary classroom 5 or 8 times during the school year. The time commitment is about 1 hour per visit 30 minutes in the classroom and 30 minutes selecting books at Rose Park Middle, driving and returning extra books.
 - Through Ready for Reading, volunteers read to a small group of preschoolers and/or one-on-one with preschoolers at their assigned child development center once a week or every other week. The time commitment is about 30 minutes per visit.
- Organize a book drive and/or donate books to our Books for Nashville Kids program – contact Debbie Settles at books@bookem-kids.org.
 - Working with your congregation, work, or club, and through birthdays, anniversaries, etc., collect books for Book'em.
 - Donate books from your bookshelves that you are ready to pass on. (Book'em can use books for adults, children and teens.)
- Volunteer in our Books for Nashville Kids book room contact Debbie Settles at books@bookem-kids.org.
 - Solunteers get incoming donated books ready to be distributed and pack up books to be given to lower-income youth throughout Davidson County. Most volunteers help in our book room about once a week for 1-2 hours.

 - Book'em gets deep discounts on books.
